JUICY JUICE/ SPY: a "Healthy Kids Day Sweepstakes

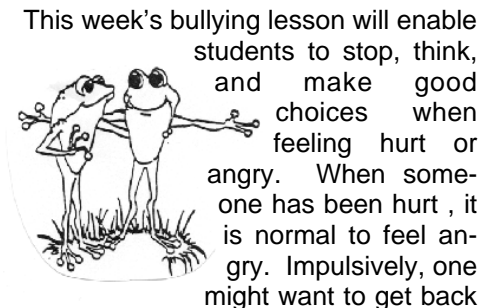

Counselor's Corner...

Managing Hurt and Angry Feelings



This week's bullying lesson will enable students to stop, think, and make good choices when feeling hurt or angry. When someone has been hurt, it is normal to feel angry. Impulsively, one might want to get back at the person by hurting him or her. But students need to know that fighting is not an option. What can they do instead of fighting or trying to hurt someone back? They can learn and practice other ways to manage their anger. In this week's lesson, students will learn "20 Things To Do Instead of Hurting Someone Back". This will include a review of Kelso's Choices (grades 1-5) and the No Violence (grades 6-8) conflict management programs which are reinforced yearly during the counselor's guidance visits.
